

2020 Capital Coexist Mini-grants



CDTC announced the 5th round of Capital Coexist Traffic Safety Ambassador Grants (a/k/a “mini-grants”) in December 2019. The program makes up to \$5,000 available to local governments, first responders, non-profits, and other organizations for small bicycle and pedestrian safety projects. An evaluation committee consisting of CDTC Staff, a Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee member, NYS Department of Transportation and NYS Department of Health, reviewed 10 project proposals requesting over \$28,000 and approved the following projects.
