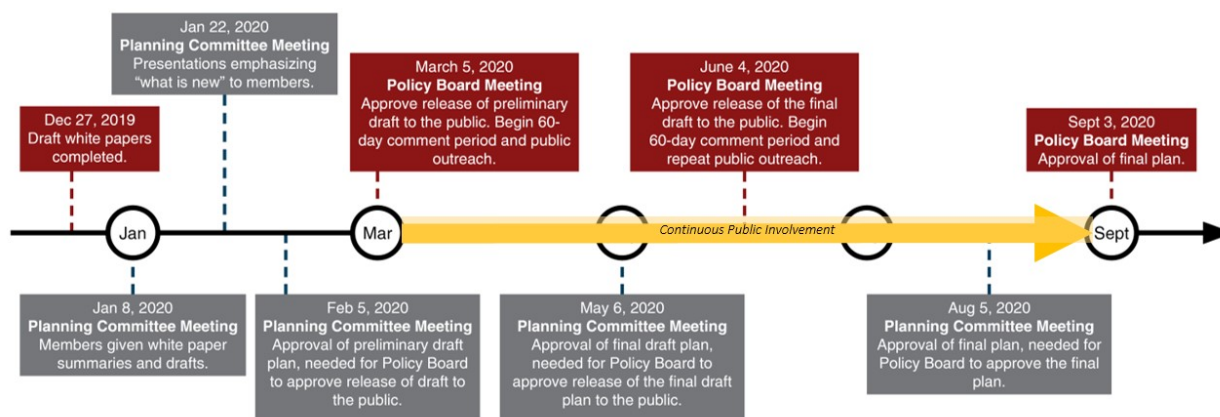
1. Public Participation Plan Updates

Updated Timeline

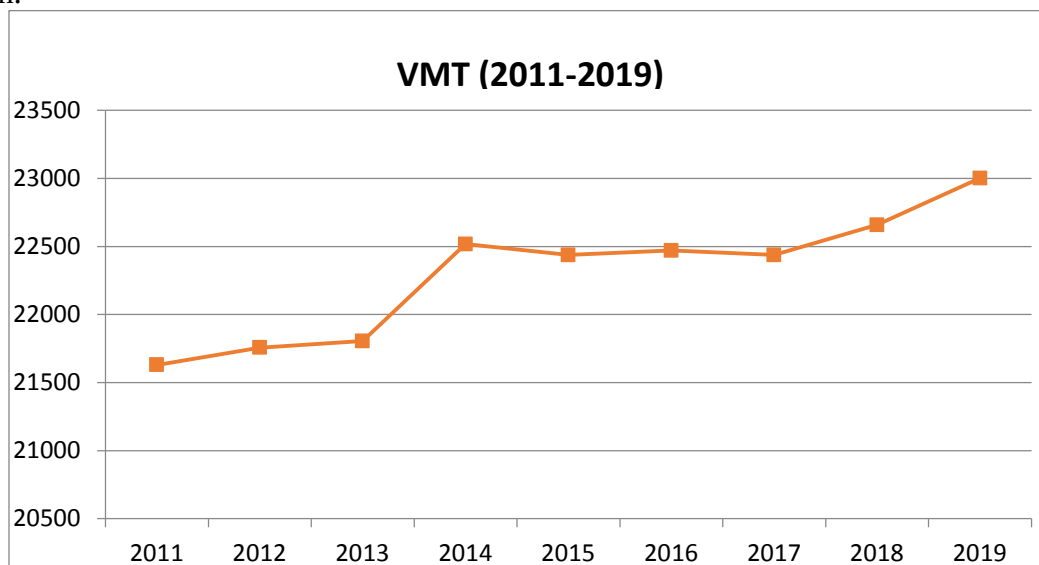
