CDTC Products and Public Participation

The table below describes the key products developed by CDTC. Staff is proposing to amend the Public Review Period for the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), Planning Studies, Title VI Plan, Congestion Management Plan (CMP), and ADA Self-Analysis. The public review periods are minimums and CDTC's public participation goals remain the same: establish a thorough, inclusive process that uses creative approaches to offer the public continuous opportunities to share the region's transportation system.
